

**CITY OF DASHER  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
DECEMBER 3, 2007**

This meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Allen and he also gave the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance followed. There were 4 citizens who attended the meeting. Mayor Allen asked for corrections or additions to the minutes. There being none, Councilman Lieupo made motion to accept the minutes, Councilman Stewart seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Report of City Attorney – Mr. Turner discussed the HB 489 and stated all issues are basically resolved. The Parks and Recreation issue is the only thing to affect Dasher. An Authority will be established and the smaller cities will have a representative on a rotating basis that will allow one vote. Mr. Turner stated the details still needed to be worked out. He also explained the road maintenance and water/sewer issues but Dasher is not affected by that. There was discussion about pros and cons for turning over our park and community center. This is an opt-out participation.

Citizen Concerns- None.

Mayor's Concerns– Mayor stated it was time to start the budget process and asked for council to give insight for the FY2008 budget.

Council Concerns - Councilman Armstrong stated James Rosenbaum was working on the sign replacement. Councilman Stewart stated he wanted lights put on the sign at Community Center. Councilman Copeland stated he would work on that. Councilman Lieupo stated he had not heard from Charlie Clark regarding TLS. Councilman Copeland presented 2 samples for fencing but they are residential grade and not commercial. Councilman Copeland stated we needed another street light along the gym on Dasher Road or rearrange existing light for more visibility. He will consult with Georgia Power on this matter and the spot light for Community Center. Mayor stated he preferred to rearranging if possible to eliminate the cost of another light. Councilman Copeland announced the museum was continuing to get items donated.

Mayor then wished everyone a Merry Christmas and a safe and Happy New Year. He announced the workshop meeting on December 17 has been cancelled.

There being no further discussion Councilman Stewart made a motion for adjournment, Councilman Armstrong seconded the motion and the motion carried unanimously. This meeting adjourned at 6:35 p.m.
