

**CITY OF DASHER  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
JUNE 5, 2006**

This meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Allen. Councilman Copeland gave the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance followed. There were 7 citizens who attended this meeting. Mayor Allen asked for corrections of additions to the minutes. There being none, Councilman Lieupo made motion to accept the minutes with the correction, Councilman Stewart seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Al Turner reported that he sent a notice to Patsy Terry regarding the last remaining mobile home. The notice was sent on May 5. He has received no response from Ms. Terry so we are now able to dispose of this mobile home. Mr. Turner stated he drafted an ordinance for Dasher to have their own municipal court. There would need to have 2 public readings of this ordinance. We will need to retain a judge, set specific meeting times, and other minute details. Mr. Turner suggested we keep traffic citations with the Sheriff's office and State Patrol. We will review the ordinance and discuss this at the workshop meeting.

Citizens Concerns: Joanne Mathis of 367 Maggie Lane complained of excessive speeding on Maggie Lane. She requested the city furnish speed bumps. Councilman Copeland asked if there were any speed signs on this road? She said there were no speed control signs. Councilman Lieupo asked Edwin Smith to look at the azalea bushes overhanging this road. There was discussion on much fast the speed on this road should be. There was also discussion on having the sheriff patrol provide more service in this area. Councilman Lieupo asked if we could ask Ricky, in his sheriff deputy capacity, to speak with the Jim Thornhill family since most of the complaints are regarding visitors to their house.

Mayor's Discussion – Mayor Allen announced the remaining mobile home would be disposed of after proper notification was given. He would like 2-3 bids for the removal. Councilman Stewart had someone approach him about moving it and he advised him to discuss this with Mayor Allen. Councilman Copeland suggested we let the fire fighters burn it for practice. He will discuss this with the fire department. Mayor Allen stated the closing for the Renfro property would be July 7. Our appraisal should be ready by the workshop meeting. We will have Charlie Clark give us drawings on how to fix the dam and we will take bids for this project. Mrs. Green voiced her concern as to why the council felt we needed to buy this property. Mayor Allen stated it was to open the road that was illegally closed and would give the citizens of Triple Lakes another way in and out. Mrs. Green stated the road was in no shape to provide for extra traffic and it is hardly fit to be used for the citizens living on this road now. She asked why Mr. Renfro was not made to fix the mess he created? She questioned why Dasher wasted the money

to buy this property. She also complained that the other side of the pond has excessive traffic with excessive speeds and use of 4 wheelers. Mrs. Green said her neighbors stopped Mr. Renfro from coming across the private property and asked how the city felt it was going to cross private property? Edwin Smith explained the egress and ingress as was stated on their plats. Mayor Allen told her that the city would have control over the water level so the flooding situation should not happen again. The rest of the property would be donated for Green Space program. Mayor Allen feels a lot of good will come from purchasing this property and hopes the Triple Lake Subdivision owners will feel that Dasher is trying to help them. Mr. Smith also related that his side of the pond owners purchased a tractor and is working on the roads. He says they will work together to help get her road fixed as well. Councilman Copeland thanked her for her concerns and related how the city has struggled with ways to help the citizens of Triple Lakes. Edwin asked if we could put up signs that would be enforceable such as to keep outside traffic out of there. Mr. Turner stated we could. Mayor Allen then discussed that we would not have a regular meeting in July due to the holiday. We would resume with our workshop meeting and convene regular meetings in August.

Council Concerns - Councilman Armstrong had nothing to report. Councilman Stewart had nothing to report. Councilman Lieupo asked where Ricky put real estate signs that were picked up. They are in city hall. Councilman Copeland asked that the fire station was made aware that they were leaving lights on at times. He will discuss at the workshop meeting about ways to get the sulphur smell out of the water.

There being no further discussion, Councilman Armstrong made a motion to adjourn the meeting, Councilman Stewart seconded this motion and the meeting adjourned at 7:05 p.m.
