

**CITY OF DASHER  
REGULAR COUNCIL MEETING  
SEPTEMBER 5, 2005**

This meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m. by Mayor Allen. Mayor Allen gave the Invocation and the Pledge of Allegiance followed. There was 1 citizen who attended this meeting. Mayor Allen asked for corrections or additions to the minutes. There being none Councilman Lieupo made motion to accept the minutes, Councilman Stewart seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Ryan Warren was sworn in as a member of the Zoning Board of Appeals.

Report of City Attorney – Mr. Turner was unable to attend this meeting.

Second Reading of Georgia Power Franchise – Mayor Allen read this agreement in its entirety. Afterwards, he asked for discussion from citizens or council. There being none, Councilman Stewart made motion to approve this agreement, Councilman Armstrong seconded this and it carried unanimously.

Mayor Allen discussed the Johnston Road paving project. He received an estimated quote of \$28,677.97 from Scruggs Company. Scruggs was able to give us a reduced amount since they would be in the area and would already have their equipment here. Councilman Lieupo made motion to approve the bid, Councilman Stewart seconded the motion and it carried unanimously.

Citizen Concerns – There were no citizen concerns.

Mayor Comments – Mayor Allen reported that Pam Kallil was our caterer for the Dasher Day Celebration which will be held on October 22 from 12 noon- 4:00 p.m. He stated he would try to get a bouncer for children's entertainment. We will rent a tent and chairs. Mayor Allen then read reports of price gouging and information to report such. He announced qualifying for Jubie's, Ronnie's and his seat will be held September 12-16. Fees for mayor will be \$72.00 and Council seats of \$54.00.

Council Concerns – Councilman Armstrong asked if we had a fire burning ordinance. All citizens are to call the Georgia Forestry Commission and they will issue a burning permit over the phone. Councilman Stewart had nothing to report. Councilman Lieupo stated Ben Wisenbaker was contacted about Jimmy Sublett road needed attention. There was discussion if this was a private road and whose responsibility for its upkeep would be. Councilman Lieupo stated he would call Al Turner and ask if the city is responsible for the easement. The Clerk will

call RDC for verification of public or private road status of Jimmy Sublett road. Councilman Armstrong asked if the city wanted to proceed with the Christmas tree chipping project. There being little interest over the last years, the Mayor/Council decided not to participate.

There being no further discussion, Mayor Allen made motion for adjournment, Councilman Armstrong seconded this motion and this meeting adjourned at 6:30 p.m.
